# An Introduction to Safe BABYSITTING

**Babysitting is a big responsibility.** When you babysit, you're responsible for a child's life.

This booklet will give you a glimpse into the responsibilities of a babysitter. To learn more about the safety skills, first aid and rescue skills, child care training, and business skills you need to babysit, go to safesitter.org and find a class near you!

Being a good babysitter starts with being prepared. Here are a few quick guidelines about some of the things you will need to do in order to be prepared.



Know the indoor and outdoor safety rules you should follow, as well as any additional house rules that the employer may have about

television and computer use, off-limit areas of the house, and outside play.

Be aware of your own personal safety and protect the privacy of the family you are babysitting for. Avoid posting online about your babysitting job,

and do not take pictures of the children you are watching without permission from the employer.

Make sure you have access to a cell phone or a landline phone for communication with the employer and for emergency use.



#### Have the name and number of a nearby back-up adult

that you can contact for help if you need it.
